Not to downplay any of it, because we are all affected by major events, but we can take some relief and satisfaction in knowing that great things happened in East Montgomery County this year that will positively impact the area for years to come.

## EMC 2022 Review

### \* Conference and Events Center

EMCID announced in April plans to build a conference center featuring a 55,000 sf. ballroom/exhibition hall, 20,000 sf. of meeting space, and another 25,000 sf. of pre-function and lobby space and outdoor courtyards. The project is expected to have a \$1.73 billion economic impact over the next 30 years.

#### \* 64-Acre Park

In May, EMCID completed the purchase of 64 acres along FM 1485 and Caney Creek that will be developed as a dog park and hike and bike trails.

#### \* Grand Parkway Segments H & I

TxDOT opened segments of the Grand Parkway that connect I-69 in New Caney to I-10 in Mont Belvieu. The highway expansion makes it easier for folks who live in adjacent counties and beyond to visit amenities in our area.

### \* Sales Strong in EMC

Sales tax revenue collected by EMCID, the fire departments, and cities of Patton Village and Splendora saw an increase of more than 16% over 2021.

### \* New Dining Options

This summer EMCID announced that Saltgrass Steak House will join the expanding lineup of restaurants at Valley Ranch Town Center, Houston's 4th ranked open air shopping center. Others like Rosati's, Jersey Mike's, and Grab 'N' Go Tacos opened across EMC.

#### \* More Retail at Valley Ranch Town Center

Construction began on a new section of Valley Ranch that will connect Academy to a 135,000 sf. Target, HomeGoods, Victoria's Secret, and Carter's.

### \* Developers Take Over I-69/FM 1485 Corner

Criss Cross Development Group and Property Commerce began working jointly to develop the southwest portion of the intersection, which will add nearly 160,000 sf. of retail and dining from the site of the former middle school all the way to just south of Walmart.

### \* Husteel to Bring Jobs, Revenue to Splendora ISD

South Korean company Husteel is expanding operations in Splendora that will result in 100 jobs for residents, and the \$120 million project increases Splendora ISD's revenue by 8%.

### \*Value of Industrial Park Grows to Nearly \$300 million

With the addition of Lowe's, Multi-Seal, Multi-Wing, Future Frame USA, and a continually expanding New Caney Beverage, total property values in the industrial park are nearly \$300 million. That's more jobs for EMC and more revenue for our constables, fire departments, and school districts.

### \* Law Enforcement Dinner Grows

Our annual appreciation dinner and awards ceremony has grown so large and popular, we held it at the Nathaniel Center in Kingwood this year and will continue to do so until the conference center is built.

EMCID has promised positive things for the community. As we say in some of our marketing materials, *Better Shopping. Better Dining. Better Living.* We believe those things go hand in hand.

On a final note, as the holiday season and 2023 approach, I like to think that Christmas is actually more than a day; it is actually found throughout the year whenever faith overcomes doubt, hope overshadows despair, and love triumphs over hate.
